I am greatly honoured and humbled to take this opportunity to convey SADC's deep gratitude to His Excellency Robert Gabriel Mugabe, President of the Republic of Zimbabwe, and to the Government and the people of Zimbabwe for their generosity in donating to SADC, premises with developed infrastructure for SADC's Regional Peacekeeping Training Centre (RPTC).

In February 2005, the SADC Council of Ministers meeting held in Grand Baie, Republic of Mauritius, officially established the RPTC as a SADC Centre. A Host Agreement was then signed in August 2005 between the Government of the Republic of Zimbabwe and SADC through which the Centre was transformed into a fully-fledged SADC institution.

The Centre specializes in training the military, police and civilian personnel mainly from the SADC region with the main objective of assisting in achieving sustainable peace, stability and development in our region.

I am proud to inform you, Your Excellencies, that the activities of the Centre are mainly funded by SADC Member States. This clearly shows the region's commitment to the Centre and to peace, security, stability and regional development.

### Your Excellencies,

The premises sit on 16 acres of land, while a quarter is currently utilized, leaving a lot of scope for future development. A development plan has been prepared and resources mobilization efforts are ongoing. I wish to take this opportunity to assure you that the Secretariat is committed in ensuring that resources are mobilized and the land is utilized to the fullest.

Further developments will enable the Centre to expand its capacity and consequently contribute positively in the enhancement of the capacity of SADC to participate in peace support operations.

In conclusion, I wish to take this opportunity to thank SADC Member States for the continued financial, material and human resources assistance to the Centre, and appeal for continued support to the Centre.

Finally, I wish to once again thank His Excellency President Robert Mugabe, the Government and people of Zimbabwe for donating this Centre to SADC.
