BACKGROUND

Economic development and integration has been on the SADC agenda since April 01, 1980 when the ***Declaration Southern Africa: Toward Economic Liberation*** was signed in Lusaka, Zambia. Setting out accelerated economic development and regional self-reliance as its twin objectives, the Declaration committed the countries of Southern Africa to work harmoniously to integrate their economies and gradually reduce their dependence, particularly, but not only, on the then apartheid Republic of South Africa.

The Declaration appealed for external cooperation and international support for development to be “achieved more rapidly” and “effective within the context of global cooperation.” However, Collective efforts of the people and the governments of the region were identified as the only guarantee for the success of this initiative.

Implementation of the SADC Programme of Action has been on-going for the past 35 years. As SADC commemorates its 35th anniversary, it is deemed fit for a Public Lecture to take place as part of the 35th SADC Summit of Heads of State and Government activities, aimed at facilitating discourse on the economic development and integration of the region and in so doing, serve to take stock of how economic development and integration has been faring over the past three and a half decades.
