News

SADC at COP16

SADC participated in the UNFCCC COP16 in Cancun (Mexico) and organised a daily briefing for the delegates from all SADC countries in which they could discuss and raise issues of particular importance to them during the negotiations. Joint SADC-EAC-COMESA side-event "REDD without boundaries – a regional approach"

On 2 December 2010, the three African regional economic integration organizations, SADC, EAC and COMESA organized a joint side-event on the topic of "REDD without boundaries – a regional approach" that took place in the Cancun Palace Hotel in Cancun, Mexico. During the event, speakers from three countries, which have started preparing for REDD, namely Democratic Republic of Congo, Tanzania and Kenya, presented their experiences and raised challenges relating to cross-border cooperation in the process of setting up a national REDD mechanism. The discussion was moderated by Mr David Lesolle and centered around the question of how a REDD mechanism can be designed so as to benefit all countries in the region. The lively discussion touched upon many issues and agreed that for setting up a successful and region-wide REDD mechanism in the SADC region cross-border and regional cooperation are important elements. In his closing remarks, Dr. Kalumbi Shangula, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Environment and Tourism of the Republic of Namibia as the Chair of SADC also emphasized the importance of a regional approach to REDD+ in order to maximize the benefits for all countries in the region and ensure common project standards across member countries.

SADC Minister's meeting in Cancun to discuss way forward

During the second week of climate negotiation in Cancun, Mexico, the SADC secretariat organised a meeting for SADC Minister's in order to brief them on the current state of negotiations. The SADC Ministers welcomed the opportunity created by the SADC Secretariat for them to meet and discuss during this important phase of the negotiations and agreed to meet again the following days to discuss updates and a way forward. Among the topics for further discussion mentioned by the Ministers were also the preparations for the next COP in 2011 in Durban, South Africa. Further, it was stressed that coordination efforts among SADC member states should be continued in the run-up to the next COP.

EU-Africa Summit: New Joint Africa EU Strategy Action Plan 2011-2013 includes Climate Change

In the new Africa EU Strategy Action Plan, Climate Change and Energy is identified as one of the priority areas for partnership and cooperation between the two regions. The overall objective is to strengthen capacity and to reinforce coherence in the international negotiation frameworks. Among the priority areas are the operationalisation of the CLIMDEV programme, strengthening of adaptation capacities in Africa as well as the fight against deforestation and REDD among others. As a result of these efforts, Africa is expected to be an active partner in the REDD+ partnership and benefit from REDD+ financing. International Year of Forests and UN Forum on Forests

The UN Forum on Forests (UNFF) met for its 9th session from 24 January to 4 February in New York. The International Year of Forests (Forests 2011) was launched officially on 2 February 2011 and aims to raise awareness on sustainable management, conservation and sustainable development of all types of forests. The UNFF adopted a resolution on Forests for People, Livelihoods and Poverty Eradication which includes sections on assessment of progress for achieving the Global Objectives on Forests and implementing the Forest Instrument; regional cooperation; means of implementation; and actions for states and other relevant actors.
