SOUTHERN AFRICAN DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY TOWARDS A COMMON FUTURE

SADC Harmonised Consumer Price Indices (HCPI) June 2013

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As measured by the HCPI, the annual inflation rate for the SADC Region was 6.8% in June 2013 compared to June 2012. Monthly inflation rate was 0.1% in June 2013, an increase of 0.4 percentage points compared to the rate in May 2013.

Introduction

This is the sixth issue of the news release relating to Stage 2 or the full scale HCPI for the SADC region. It is also the twenty-third in series since the launch of news releases on SADC HCPI initiative.

Annual Inflation rates for SADC Member States

The reported annual inflation rates for June 2013 for Member States indicate that Malawi once again registered the highest rate of 28.7% among the SADC countries, whereas Democratic Republic of Congo recorded the lowest rate of 1.5%. For Malawi this is the fourteenth month in a row that it has continuously recorded highest, double digit inflation rate among the SADC Member States. Annual rates for the rest of the other Member States were reported as follows: Botswana (6.3%), Lesotho Madagascar (5.7%), (5.6%), Mauritius (4.0%), Mozambique (5.4%). Namibia (8.4%), Seychelles (4.8%), South Africa (6.2%), Swaziland (3.0%), Tanzania (8.2%), Zambia (10.2%)

and Zimbabwe (4.1%) as reflected in table 2 below.

Compared to the SADC regional annual average inflation rate of 6.8%, ten countries recorded rates below the regional annual inflation rate for June 2013. Four countries registered rates higher than the regional average. See figure 3 below for more details.

Month on month Inflation rates for SADC Member States


Six countries recorded declines ranging from -0.1 to -0.9 percent, in their month on month inflation. Tanzania, which has the second highest country weight in the SADC HCPI, was among the countries that recorded negative month on month inflation rates. The other countries which recorded negative monthly inflation rates include Lesotho, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique and Zimbabwe. The remaining countries recorded increases and the highest monthly increase was recorded by Zambia (1.3%) as reflected in table 1 below.

Annual Inflation Rates by COICOP divisions

In terms of Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) major divisions, all divisions increases in their registered indices in June 2013 compared to June 2012 as follows: Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco (8.7%), Miscellaneous Goods and Services (7.7%), Housing, Electricity, Water, Gas and Other Fuels (7.5%), Recreation and Culture (6.9%), Transport (6.3%), Food and Non Alcoholic Beverages (6.2%). Communications (4.9%), Clothing and Footwear (4.6%), Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Maintenance of House (4.6%), and Restaurants and Hotels (4.0%). See table 4 below.

Month on Month Inflation Rates by COICOP divisions

Food and non-alcoholic beverages together with Health divisions of COICOP registered declines of 0.2% and 0.1% respectively in their monthly indices. All the other divisions recorded increases. Table 3 below provides details.








Figure 2: Annual inflation rate (%) in SADC region for the period: June 2012 to June 2013







Figure 4: COICOP Divisions annual inflation rates as at June 2013



The annual rate measures the price change between the current month and the corresponding month of the previous year. The rate is responsive to recent changes in price levels but it can also be influenced by one-off effects in either month.

The 12 month average compares the average HCPI in the latest 12 months to the average of the previous 12 months. It overcomes

The Harmonised Consumer Price Index

The Harmonised Consumer Price Index (HCPI) is defined as the Consumer Price Index (CPI) developed from comparable methodologies. That means CPIs which have been developed from the concepts, definitions and methods that are comparable. CPIs are economic indicators that measure changes overtime of prices of consumer goods and services purchased by households. HCPI is meant to provide an official measure of inflation in the region, and it makes international comparisons easier since the national HCPIs are produced using harmonised methodologies and as much is practicable using the same classifications, statistical standards and frameworks.

Both the HCPIs and national CPIs measure inflation faced by consumers, and use the same data sources in most part. However, the two measure inflation with different aims and therefore, sometimes june use different concepts and methods. HCPI's main use is for monetary policy, and is used as one of the convergence criteria to assess compliance of Member States to economic unions and to monitor progress towards integration. Member states of economic unions are given target inflation levels to achieve, in specified period to be considered for some preferential treatments within the integration. And this requires a harmonised conceptual framework and comparable results. The national CPIs in addition to being the measure of inflation have many other purposes such as cost of living which june require different methodologies. The Member States HCPIs are

the volatility of the annual measure. The monthly rate measures the price change between the two latest months. Although up to date, it can be affected by seasonal and other short-term effects

States using agreed harmonised methodologies. The SADC HCPI is compiled by the SADC Secretariat by aggregating the National HCPIs of the Member States. These are calculated as weighted averages of the national HCPIs, using as weights each country's total household consumption expenditure converted to a common currency using the purchasing power parities derived from the results of the 2005 (for HCPIs prior to January 2013) and 2009 (For HCPIs since January 2013) International Comparison Program as supplied by the African Development Bank and the World Bank.

More information on SADC HCPI methodology can be availed on demand.
