SADC Electoral Observation Mission (SEOM) to the Presidential, Legislative and Provincial Elections of the Democratic Republic of Congo scheduled for the 20th of December 2023

13th **December 2023, Gaborone, Botswana:** In line with the five-year electoral cycle of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), the Member State will hold Presidential, Legislative and Provincial Elections on 20 December 2023. This is in line with Article 3 of the *revised SADC Principles and Guidelines Governing Democratic Elections (2021),* which provides that SADC shall observe all general elections held in its Member States.

In accordance with the SADC Guidelines, His Excellency (H.E.) Hakainde Hichilema, President of the Republic of Zambia, and Chairperson of the SADC Organ on Politics, Defence and Security Cooperation, appointed Mr. Enoch Kavindele, former Vice President of the Republic of Zambia as the Head of Mission (HoM) and mandated the SADC Secretariat to coordinate the SEOM, including facilitation of in-country deployment of observers. H.E. further appointed Ambassador Lazarous Kapambwe as the Alternate Head of Mission.

The SEOM will be deployed to eighteen (18) out of twenty-six (26) Provinces of the Democratic Republic of Congo to observe the pre and post-election phases and the polling day. The Mission's objective is to assess the conduct of the elections in accordance with the revised SADC Principles and Guidelines Governing Democratic Elections of (2021). These principles emphasise the importance of citizen participation in the democratic and development processes, the implementation of measures to prevent political violence, intimidation, and intolerance, and the promotion of equal opportunities for all political parties to access the State Media and for all citizens to access information. Furthermore, the Mission emphasises the significance of acceptance and respect for the election results by all political parties.

Accordingly, in line with the revised SADC Principles and Guidelines Governing Democratic Elections (2021), the Secretariat is expected to coordinate technical, logistical and administrative arrangements for deploying the SEOM to the DRC. The Secretariat facilitated a Pre-Deployment Refresher Training for the observers and will manage the overall activities of the SEOM.

To promote electoral integrity, electoral justice, good governance, peace and stability in the SADC region, and to give effect to the commitment contained in the SADC Principles and Guidelines, the Launch of SEOM which will be held on the 15th December 2023 at Fleuve

Congo Hotel, Kinshasa, DRC will include various election awareness activities for the electoral stakeholders to learn and appreciate the work of the SEOM.
