I am greatly honoured to, once again, welcome you and your delegations to Zimbabwe. Let me, from the outset, extend my sincere appreciation to you for allowing us this opportunity to gather here at short notice, in spite of your busy schedules.

Allow me, Excellencies, to extend a special, and warm welcome to our dear colleague, His Excellency, Advocate Duma Gideon Boko, President of the Republic of Botswana. I would also like to, once again congratulate you on your election. We are confident that with your leadership and wisdom, we will, together help maintain our Region as a beacon of hope, prosperity, peace and security.

Your Excellencies;

We recently, convened here in August 2024, in Ordinary Session, to take stock of our progress over the past year, and, also, to come up with strategies on how best we can resolve our common challenges. Today, we are gathered here, to deliberate on pertinent issues relating to the peace and security of our region.

Together, we must stand resolute against common challenges, honouring the legacy of our Founding Fathers, who demonstrated that unity and cooperation as critical to achieving durable peace and prosperity for our peoples.

As we deliberate on the future of SAMIDRC, let us be reminded that our region is faced with other challenges such as the climate change induced drought due to the El Nino, and Mpox virus.

Excellencies, the people of the DRC deserve peace. Our region deserves peace. I wish to commend fellow SADC countries, Malawi, Tanzania and South Africa for deploying troops and military equipment critical for sustaining our efforts towards restoring peace and stability in DRC. We owe you a huge debt of gratitude for your sacrifices.

The report before us provides a grave picture of the security and the humanitarian situation in the Eastern DRC, with over 6,5 million civilians having been displaced, resulting in a humanitarian crisis. It is the civilian population, the women and children that bear the brunt of the conflict. It is, therefore, important that today, we chart the way forward towards winning the fight against negative forces in the Eastern part of DRC. This will be an important step towards our overarching goal of ensuring lasting peace and development in our region.

Once again, I warmly welcome you to Zimbabwe and invite you to make use of the facilities that we have put at your disposal for a successful Summit. I wish us all fruitful deliberations.
